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Synchronous vs. Asynchronous time

Synchronous time is defined as "Everyone is learning at the same time, but not the same place" This takes place when your child's teacher is LIVE on a Google Meets call.

Asynchronous time is defined as "Everyone is learning, but not at the same time" This takes place when your child's teacher assigns lessons for students to work on their own.

Teachers have created a schedule to include times for both types of learning during the day

Reduce Distractions!!

Create a quiet, clutter-free workspace away from any distractions
Check devices for "web surfing" during class time. Students should
be present and participating during synchronous learning time



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Tips for Parents of Students Doing Distance Learning

- 1 Help your child establish and stick to a routine.
 - a. Know your child's school schedule
 - b. Create schedules for bedtime, wake up, breakfast etc
 - c. Visual Checklist might help some students
- 2 Check in with your child's teachers/principal.
 - d. We are all here for support!

- 3 Encourage physical activity and exercise.
 - f. Encourage time away from devices when students aren't in school



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Tips for Parents of Students Doing Distance Learning

- 4 Resist the urge to sit in on classes with your child.
 - a. Do not give your students the answers! Let your child struggle so teachers can find out where they get stuck!
 - Teachers drive their instruction based on what students know!

5. Provide positive feedback and encouragement-

- online learning is new and can be challenging for some students
- Most students tell us that they really miss school and seeing friends

6. Take care of you.

Attendance in School

- There is a strong link between attendance and achievement
- Attendance data can be an indicator of students and schools at risk
- Reducing chronic absence is essential to turning around underperforming schools
- Improving attendance can reduce the achievement gap.
- 9 or more unexcused absences in a school year will result in a truancy intervention

District Goal= 95%

Little Fort 2017-2018=94.6%


Little Fort 2018-2019= 93.7%

School (94.5%)








Chronically Truant Students
